This workshop follows GPSA's recent research that explored GP/RG supervisors' and GP/RG registrars' willingness to express uncertainty in GP/RG training and the benefits of 'learning together'. Attendees will be encouraged to reflect on their own teaching and learning practices and contribute towards the development of guidelines to assist GP/RG supervisors and GP/RG registrars to navigate this important, but vulnerable, space to improve training in general practice.
